**Re: Toronto Hydro/City Council Request**

In connection with City council's request for public access, the Board of Directors of Toronto Hydro Corporation has directed that June 24, 2008 be set aside as "Toronto Hydro Day" and two different events be staged to showcase Toronto Hydro's programs and activities across the various affiliates.

At the first event, I will make a powerpoint presentation to City Councillors and the Mayor in Committee Room 1 at City Hall. This will be a luncheon meeting on a Council day between 12:30 and 2 pm. The Mayor is confirmed to attend. Invitations to all Councillors and their staff will be sent soon.

The presentation will focus on Toronto Hydro Electric System's Conservation and Demand Management Program, our Infrastructure Rebuild, our community engagement programs, as well as Toronto Hydro Energy Services generation and efficiency projects. It will also deal with how Toronto Hydro can help the City deliver on its climate change goals. This is intended to be an interactive session that demonstrates the good working relationship between the City of Toronto and Toronto Hydro.

In addition, on June 24, Toronto Hydro has reserved Yonge-Dundas Square from 10 am to 4 pm for a public event that will showcase to passersby the many programs and opportunities that Toronto Hydro offers. This is being designed as a fun event with entertainment between 11 and 2, giveaways for kids and adults and lots of opportunities to

receive information and ask questions of employees, officers and directors of Toronto Hydro. A number of booths will be displayed at Yonge-Dundas Square that will inform the public about Toronto Hydro's Conservation and Demand Management programs, its Community Involvement program, its efforts to build renewable generation, how the streetlighting system works, and job opportunities available at Toronto Hydro.
